Half-zips:-



At the school's Board of Management meeting on 18 January, the following was agreed:

1. Half-zips only (no grey school uniform) will be compulsory for new Infants starting in September 2024.

2. The other classes have the option of half-zip or continuing to wear their navy tracksuit only and **not** grey school uniform for 2024/25. This optional clause will be reviewed during the 2024/25 academic year.

3. Plain navy tracksuit pants only - no crest required & available to purchase from the store of parents' choice.

4. Royal Blue or Sky Blue polo shirt.

5. Due diligence to be carried out on proposed supplier BT Sports and the Principal & Parent Association members lo liaise with the company to finalise arrangements for sizing/ordering/payment/collection of half-zips.
