

Jelly fish Art

You will need

- Blue card or any colour you would like, if you do not have card use the back of a cereal box and colour or paint it blue
- 2 sheets of A4 paper
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Black marker
- Colours/Paint and paintbrush
- Scissors
- Glue

Procedure

1. Draw the shape of the jellyfish head on A4 paper and then cut it out
2. Add two eyes and a mouth using a black marker
3. Next take a second sheet of A4 paper and draw lines of 2cm width across the whole page (do not cut these out yet)
4. Then take your colours or paint and colour/paint the jellyfish head and the page of lines And then leave to dry if you painted these

		<ol style="list-style-type: none">5. Next take your sheet of lines and cut along the lines to form the tentacles6. Stick the jellyfish head to the blue card7. Roll each tentacle around your pencil to get the end to curl and then stick each tentacle to the blue card
