Leadership and Management Team

The LMT consists of Mr Will Ryan (Principal), Mrs Bríd Callanan (Deputy Principal), Mrs Sharon Perdue (Assistant Principal II), Katie Cowan (Assistant Principal III), Caitríona Crosse (APII), Jennifer O'Farrell (APII) and Pat Molloy (APII). A new API post holder will be appointed in September. The team meets every fortnight with DEIS action planning to the forefront of its work this year.

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<u>Staff Training</u> - The Board is very grateful to all school staff who undertook a significant amount of further professional development and training throughout the school year. CPD is a very important part of any school and we have a professional development budget to encourage staff training in priority areas.

<u>Child Safeguarding and Anti-Bullying</u> are on the agenda of every Board of Management meeting. The Board welcomes any comments in relation to these two policies which are available on our school website @www.cashelbns.ie. Co-incidentally, our website is currently being revamped and we hope to launch our new and improved site before the new academic year or certainly in Term 1 of 2023/24.

<u>Seomra na Rí ASD Class</u> - We moved into the modular accommodation on 21 November 2018 and we still await our new building extension. It has been a painfully slow process but the Board is delighted with the progress that has been made since Christmas. We hope to move into our new extension (2 ASD classes and 2 mainstream classes) in September 2024. The new car park/drop off zone will be a significant plus for our school communities as well.

Attendance — Our Deputy Principal Mrs Callanan has responsibility for attendance and attendance statistics and trends form part of the Principal's report at every meeting. <u>Pastoral Care</u> - Thank you to Father Enda Brady, our school chaplain, for his presence and unwavering support of our school community. His work with the sacramental classes is very meaningful, but Enda is there for us all regardless of our backgrounds.

Amber Flag and Student Council – The Board is kept up to date with the excellent work of the Student Leadership committees. Student voice is very important and the Principal keeps us all informed on what's going on with the boys during his comprehensive Principal's Report at each Board meeting. Comhghairdeas to our Amber Flag committee for their hard work on achieving our second consecutive Amber flag.

<u>Graduation</u> - 41 of our pupils leave very soon for pastures new. The Board would like to wish the boys and their families the very best as they start their new adventure. Thank you for everything and go well!

The boys (why we all do what we do!) - Probably the favourite part of our Board meetings is hearing about what's actually happening on the ground with the boys. We're amazed at the breadth of experiences that the boys are exposed to. We love hearing about reading achievements and the drive to get our boys reading for enjoyment. We loved following Colin O'Brien's outstanding achievements in spelling this year and Ben Fitzgerald's great accomplishment in making the Primary Game hurling team. We smiled, laughed and cried (well not quite!) as we followed the progress of our U13s as they got to the A Cumann na mBunscol final in Semple Stadium.

<u>Building & Summer Works</u>- No summer works in the pipeline, but building work on our extension will continue hopefully at pace over the summer months!

<u>Policy Development & DEIS</u> -Every year, many curriculum and organisational policies/plans are discussed and reviewed at Board level. This year was no exception. We are grateful to all members of the school community for engaging so readily as we all work on making our school the best that it can be. As we were designated DEIS status this year, the Board has been appraising the action planning undertaken by the staff. We are also delighted that all pupils now have access to a free hot lunch every day. We see our

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new designation as a distinct advantage to ALL pupils in our community and look forward to engaging even further in the years ahead.
